<p>Occupational Health Safety 1 and 2 Courses These 2 courses have been added as new compulsory courses.</p>	<p>All students have been exempted from these courses in English language.</p>
<p>Physiology This course has been made compulsory in the new syllabus, while it was elective in the old syllabus.</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Grade of the students who passed this course have been transferred to the same course on the new syllabus. The student has also been exempted from an elective course group he did not take in English language. 2. Students who have not taken this course or have failed the course: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) If the student is in the last class or in higher classes, student has been exempted from this course in English language. b) If the student is 1st, 2nd or 3rd class, this course is left as a compulsory course for student. <p>Departmental Elective Courses Elective 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14 in the old syllabus Elective 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 in the new syllabus</p>	<p>The number of elective courses is the same for both old and new syllabuses.</p> <p>The elective courses you have passed in the old syllabus have been transferred to the elective courses given in the equivalence table. If there is more than required courses in an elective course group, the extra course have been transferred to a course in the elective course group with the lowest number that the student did not attend.</p> <p>Example: If the student have passed 2 courses in elective group 4 (biosensors and stoichiometry), there is 1 extra course in this group. Student did not attend the courses in elective groups 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9. For this reason, the elective course groups for which the student did not attend are checked. Grade of stoichiometry is transferred to a course that is closest to the stoichiometry in Elective 5, which is the smallest group from 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 course groups, and the stoichiometry is deleted from the course list of the student.</p>
<p>Social Elective Courses Elective 1 and 3 in the old syllabus Elective 1 and 2 in the new syllabus</p>	<p>Social elective courses taken from the old syllabus are transferred to the Elective 1 and Elective 2 course groups.</p> <p>If the student has taken more than 2 social elective courses, the extra social elective courses are left as pooled courses and will be deleted when the student graduates. There was no transfer of grades to another elective course for these extra courses.</p>
